Founding Partner of Stratus Group. Chairman or member of the board of several Stratus' portfolio companies. Previously was a partner of Newbridge Latin America, a PE fund affiliated to the Texas Pacific Group (TPG). Was head of M&A at Banco Pactual, with assignments in several sectors. Prior to that, was an engagement manager at McKinsey & Co, in São Paulo, Houston and Mexico, where worked for clients in energy, steel, mining and beverage industries. Worked as senior field engineer at Schlumberger, based in Mexico and Argentina. Holds a degree in Aeronautical Engineering from ITA – Instituto Tecnológico de Aeronáutica (Brazil) and a MBA from INSEAD (France).



Carlos Héneiné, Partner, Quilvest

Carlos Héneiné is co-head of Quilvest Private Equity, Emerging Markets. As such he jointly manages the team at Quilvest that oversees Private Equity Investments in Asia, Latin America and Eastern Europe, as well as Middle East and Africa. He is based in Dubai, where he is Managing Director of the office that handles co-investor relationships with regional family offices and institutions. Quilvest is the financial holding and family office of a Franco-Argentine industrial family, which was formed in 1917. Today Quilvest manages some \$35bn across all asset classes and was a pioneer in Private Equity, investing in PE since 1972 and in Latin America and Asian PE since the 1990s. Mr. Héneiné started his career at British Aerospace in the early 80's and after his MBA embarked on a 10-year stint in consulting at Booz and Mercer. He shifted to the financial services sector in the late 90's when he joined Banque Saradar as Head of Strategy, before assuming his current functions at Quilvest in 2005. Mr. Héneiné received his MBA from INSEAD and a BSc in Aeronautical Engineering from Imperial College at the University of London. Mr Heneine is married and has twin daughters.



Eduardo Leite, Chairman, Baker McKenzie

Eduardo Leite is the outgoing Chairman of Baker McKenzie the position he has held for the last six years. A partner since 1986 and an accomplished energy, infrastructure projects, and M&A lawyer, Eduardo served on Baker McKenzie's Executive Committee from 1999 to 2003 as Chairman of the Firm's Latin American Regional Council, and he chaired the Firm's Policy Committee in 2005. Prior to being elected Chairman in 2010, Eduardo was the managing partner of the Firm's four offices in Brazil, a position he held for seven years. Beginning January 1, 2017, Eduardo became Baker McKenzie's Chairman Emeritus and Senior Partner and will focus on the Firm's priority of driving growth in New York and Latin America. He will be based in

New York. During Eduardo's tenure as Chairman, Baker McKenzie opened 11 new offices in eight countries, grew its revenues by 25% and profits by 16%, and increased its increased global headcount by 31%, including an industry-record 40% average annual female partner promotions. The Firm was recently confirmed as the leading global legal brand for the seventh year in a row extending its lead on its nearest competitor. As Chairman Eduardo was a member of International Business Leaders Advisory Council for the Mayor of Beijing, a member of the World Economic Forum and Co-Chair of the Professional Services Industry Group and the chair of the US section of the US-Brazil CEO forum. Before becoming Chairman Eduardo spent several years working in Baker McKenzie's Chicago and Miami offices after joining the Firm in 1979. He also led the Firm's Global Energy, Mining & Infrastructure Industry Group. Eduardo is married and the father of two daughters. He has degrees from New York University, University of Sao Paulo and the University of Uruguay. He speaks English, French, Italian, Portuguese and Spanish. Mr. Leite's practice focuses on energy issues, mergers and acquisitions, power and renewables, as well as project finance. He has worked on almost all Brazilian privatizations either for the Brazilian government (BNDES) or for private investors. Mr. Leite led the team that successfully privatized Light Serviços de Eletricidade in Rio de Janeiro (representing AES and Reliant), had a role in the Petrobras Barracuda Caratinga Project and was lead counsel for many project finance deals in Brazil. Additionally, Mr. Leite led several major projects in connection with power plants, paper and pulp, as well as significant joint ventures, privatizations and mergers in the energy sector.

Prior to Abril, Manoel was the CEO and co-founder of WebCo the first Brazilian startup focused on the development of Web 2.0 products and with a strong culture inspired by the Silicon Valley. Before WebCo, Manoel founded and developed single-handedly BlogBlogs, the world's largest indexer of Portuguese written blogs. BlogBlogs was then acquired by Abril / Naspers and originated WebCo. Before BlogBlogs, Manoel was the CTO for Hypercom Brasil, a subsidiary of Hypercom Corporation in the USA and a leading provider of payment solutions for the credit card and banking industries. Earlier in his career Manoel has worked and a software engineer, solutions architect and Internet specialist for local companies, the Government of Brazil and the European Community. Manoel earned a B.S. in Computer Engineering from UNICAMP where he also did several years of research and has an incomplete masters degree in high performance computing. He also holds an ACE from the Sloan Business School from MIT and executive education on Strategy for Media Companies at Harvard Business School and Venture Capital at Haas Business School in University of California Berkeley.
